Vocabulary related to:

Perception: The way you think about something and your idea of what it is like.

Jokes: something that you say or do to make people laugh, especially a funny story or trick.

Analysis: a careful examination of something in order to understand it better.

Pace: The speed at which something happens or is done.

Intonation: The rise and fall of the voice in speech.



Vocabulary

Vocabulary related to short stories:

Setting: The place where something is or where something happens.

Characters: A person represented in a film, play, or story.

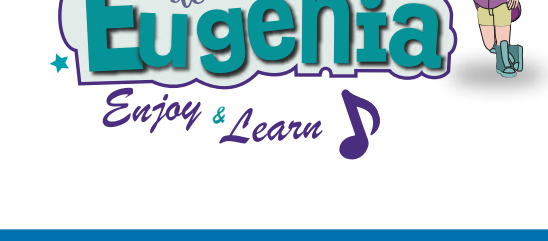
Plot: The events that form the main story of a book, film, or play.

Conflict: Arguments or a disagreement between people.

Resolution: The act of solving or ending a problem or difficulty.

Point of view: An opinion.

Theme: The main subject of a talk, book, film, etc.



Vocabulary

Vocabulary related to expressions to give opinions:

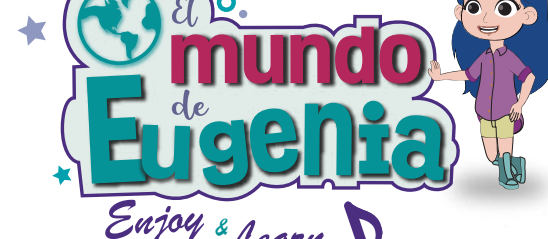
In my opinion.....: Used to give your opinion about something.

I think you should....: Used to give advice or instructions.

Why don't you...? : Used to make a suggestion.

Personally, I believe....: Used to introduce an opinion.

I feel that....: Used to express feelings or thoughts.



Vocabulary

For example: Used before mentioning a specific thing, person, place, etc. in order to explain what you mean or to support an argument.

In other words: Used when you are expressing an idea or opinion again in a different and usually simpler way.

Trustworthy: Able to be trusted

Horrible: Very unpleasant or bad

Should: Used to give or ask for advice

Despite: Used to say that something happens or is true even though something else might have prevented it



Vocabulary

Vocabulary related to research:

Investigation: The act of examining something carefully, to discover the truth about it.

Inquiry: The act or process of asking questions in order to get information.

Study: A piece of work that is done to find out more about a particular subject or problem, and usually includes a written report.

Research: Serious study of a subject, in order to discover new facts or test new ideas.

Examination: The act of looking at or considering something carefully in order to discover something.

Paper: A piece of writing on a particular subject written by an expert and usually published in a book or journal, or read aloud to other people.
