Simple Present: like / likes

The Simple present tense is used to talk about things we like.

Subject (I, You, We, They) + Verb “like” in the base form

Examples: I like mozzarella cheese.

I like lemonade.

When you want to make affirmative sentences in the third-person singular, you need to add 's' to the main verb.

Subject (He , She, It) + verb “like” third person plural form (+s)

Examples:

My mom likes to make broccoli pancakes for breakfast.

The school chef likes to make healthy food.

Negative sentences:

Subject (I, You, We, They) + do not/don't + verb in the base form

Example:

I don't like broccoli salad.

Subject (He , She, It) + does not/doesn't + verb in the base form

Example: He doesn't like broccoli salad.
