

Vocabulary

Vocabulary related to descriptive adjectives:

1. **Beautiful:** Something that is very pleasing to the senses, usually in terms of appearance.
2. **Interesting:** Something that gets your attention or curiosity, making you want to learn more about it.
3. **Scary:** Something that makes you feel fear or makes you feel frightened.
