Follow it with a feedback statement.

Examples:

- You always do a fantastic job on your projects.
- She usually contributes with great ideas during group work.
- We sometimes need more details in our reports.

Adding words like "always," "often," or "sometimes" (frequency adverbs) helps to describe how often something happens. Then, you say what you think about it.
